Warriors Win 2, Lose 4 on Northern Jaunt

El Camino's Warriors returned yesterday from a six-game tour of Northern California, still pondering the problem of how to win games with a starting lineup that averages only 5 feet 8 inches in height.

The wandering Warriors won two of the six games played on the road tour, and came close in three others. The only decisive loss was a 55-40 drubbing administered by San Francisco City College in the Bay City.

Coach Tom Bailey is now pointing his club for the San Barry Memorial Tournament, starting December 26 in Glendale. The Warriors draw Los Angeles City College at 1:30 on the evening of the tournament in the Glendale High gym.

TAYLOR LEADS CUBS

The Cubs, national JC basketball champs in 1950, are this year led by the sensational Mack Taylor, Los Angeles high school player of the year last season at Jefferson High.

Winner of the El Camino-LACC game will tackle the winner of the East Los Angeles JC-Fullerton game December 27.

The two losers will meet in a consolation round game at Glendale Hoover High gym, also on the 27th.

Pre-tourney favorite appears to be the high-scoring San Bernardino Valley College quintet, third place finisher in the recent Chaffey JC tournament. Other top clubs include Sacramento JC, Glendale, Reddley, Pasadena, Modesto, Orange Coast and Santa Monica.

Bailey, in an attempt to make his midcourt club stronger in the point department, has pulled his center out of the pivot position, and actually is using two men in and three out on offense. This system depends upon good ball handling and set plays to function.

The Warrior starting lineup will probably look like this for the LACC game: Bob Ross, the team's leading scorer, and Hiro Kubo at forwards, and Wayne Scholl, Dick Carrow and Bill Shea at guards, with no center.

On the recently-concluded northern jaunt, El Camino opened December 11 at Grant Tech in San Francisco, winning, 50-48. Sacramento JC edged the Warriors, 61-59, but El Camino came back the next night to top Vallejo, 83-72.
