Unemployment **Claims Subject To New Provision**

Unemployment in surance claims filed on and after Janu-ary 1, 1952, are subject to a new provision of the California Unemployment Insurance Act, Mrs. Winona Ellis, manager of the Torrance office of the State Department of Employment, said today.
