Two Torrance men are in recent news from Korea. One has received rotation orders and another is serving on the Korean central front.

Pfc. Ralph E. Standridge, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Standridge, 1214 Beech avenue, who landed with X Corps troops during the Inchon invasion 15 months ago, will shortly be back in the United States. He has been a member of the transportation section of X Corps headquarters and has participated in all X Corps campaigns. He enlisted in the Army during August, 1949, and before shipment to Korea served with occupation forces in Japan.

Pfc. Richard R. Fiedler, son of Mr. and Mrs. Carl A. Fiedler, 212 East 223rd street, is now serving in Korea with the 194th Engineer Combat Battalion, a part of IX Corps. This unit has been responsible for construction of roads, bridges and the like as well as combat fortification, including mine fields and barbed wire entanglements. As a civilian he was employed by a Long Beach lumber company.
