

'52 Auto Tabs on Sale In Neighboring Cities

Torrance residents will again be forced to travel to nearby cities to purchase their 1952 California automobile license tabs.

Nearest California Department of Motor Vehicles offices are at 303 East Palmer in Compton, or at 700 East Broadway, Long Beach.

The tabs, which went on sale yesterday, are also available in a number of banks in neighboring cities. Neither of the local banks is included.

Banks handling the tabs, which must be purchased before closing time February 4, include Security-First National Bank at 102 Pine avenue, Long Beach; Bank of America branches at 219 Pacific avenue, Redondo Beach, 131 West Anaheim boulevard, Wilmington, and 5401 North Long Beach boulevard, Long Beach, and Fisherman's and Merchants Bank, 407 West Seventh street, San Pedro.

To get new tabs at banks or Department of Motor Vehicle offices, owners of private and commercial vehicles must take in their registration certificate and the amount of the fee stamped on it.
