College Picks Haley to Make Job Survey

Richard Haley, instructor in business at El Camino College, has been selected to assist in a survey of industrial employment needs in the school district.

Dr. William Harless, El Camino director of instruction, announced the selection and said the survey is being conducted to enable the college to plan its courses to meet the needs of the community.

In addition to surveying the needs of industry, the school is making a study of the district population, age groups, and other factors which will be used as a guide in determining college educational offerings.

Preliminary meetings with employers have been held and Dr. Harless says the survey will be conducted on a continuing basis to keep the school constantly informed of the district's needs.

Camino to Offer Night Class in Concrete Work

In response to a request by Carpenter's union local 1478, El Camino College is offering a course in concrete form construction for carpenters who are on the job, but need advanced instruction.

Union business representative Dale Keyes made the request for the carpenter's union, which has headquarters in Redondo Beach.
