

All Groups Not Exempt From Tax, Bureau Warns

The new revenue law allows exemption from Federal admissions tax to certain non-profit groups which are exempt from income tax as charitable, religious or educational organizations. The collector of internal revenue points out, however, that many such organizations do not come within the provisions of the new law entitling them to exemption from admissions tax.

The collector's office explains that exemptions from the tax may not be taken by any organization in merely because it believes that it qualifys as a non-profit organization. In each in stance application for exemption must be made on Form 755, and the collector will return to the applicant a Form 775A, either granting or denying the application.
