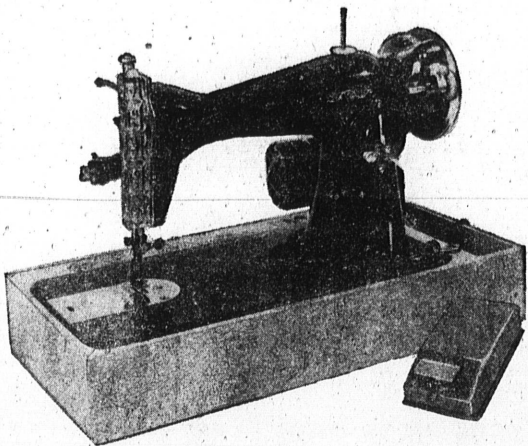

## State Releases Names of Auto Law Violators

## Help With Tax Forms Offered By Collector

In an effort to facilitate the filing of federal income tax returns, the Collector of Internal Revenue has completed arrangements for the opening of temporary offices in numerous locations throughout Southern California.

Louis E. Leary, chief field deputy in the collector's office, states that a total of 63 offices will be available, either continuously or for brief stated periods between now and the close of the filing period, which will be March 15.

Permanent offices of the collector will be open every weekday, except Saturdays, from 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m., and since the last day of the filing period falls on Saturday, it is probable that all offices will remain open on Saturday, March 15.

Offices which serve residents in this area include: Torrance, City Hall, Feb. 15-19; Inglewood, 357 E. Queen St., permanent; San Pedro, 872 E. Ninth St., permanent and Long Beach, 520 E. Fourth St., permanent.
