They have no children.

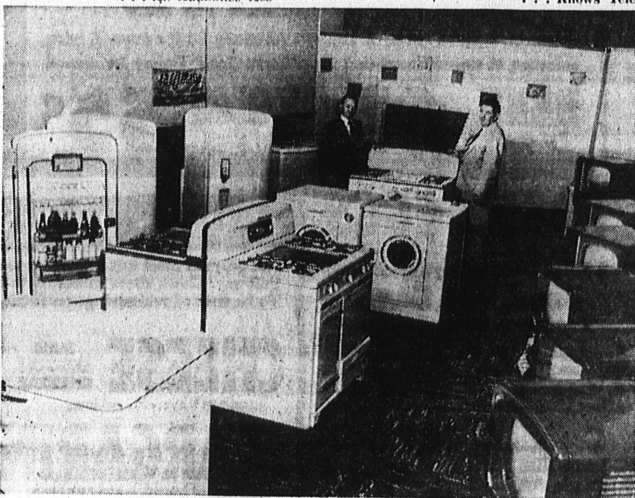

## 567 SEEK WORK HERE

Unsettled labor condition here probably accounted for the high increase of unemployed persons during the first two weeks of February, Winona Ellis, Department of Employment Office manager, said yesterday.

As of Monday there were 567 residents unemployed and seeking work, 280 of which are women and 287 men. Forty per cent are veterans.

Last month 425 available applicants were seeking work, while 447 were jobless in December.

The highest number of unemployed was in the skilled labor category, where 118 applications were received. Clerical jobs were needed by 97 persons.
