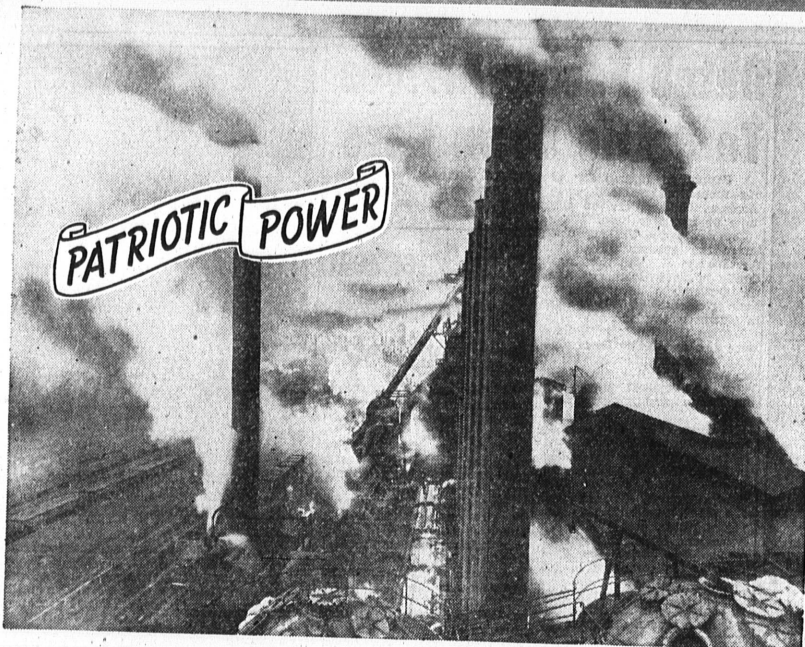

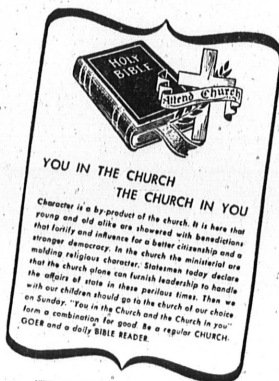
See You IN CHURCH Sunday

Formosa Report Tells Overseas Life of Pastor

Formosa-bound and by now,
the Rev. J. R. Killman should
be on the island just off the
mainland of China. Mr. Killman,
assistant pastor of the First
Baptist Church here is taking
part in a six-weeks evangelistic
tour of the Far East where he
is preaching the gospel of St.
John.

According to Formosa Report
No. 5, a periodic report written
by Mr. Killman, he and his
party will be talking with
young people, many under
Communist influence, and many
soldiers.

The young minister was out
of the running for a few days
suffering from the "screaming
mimic," or dysentery.
"The Chinese food was a bit
too tempting and I must have
indulged in the wrong thing,"
his report states. "But with the
modern sulfa drugs it is a matter
of a few days and you
are back in the harness."

Army sham battles forced a
rescheduling of original plans
and Mr. Killman has asked that
church members pray that he
and the party be allowed en-
trance into many areas now for-
bidden by military orders.

He spoke highly of Generalis-
simo Chiang Kai Shek and his
wife, and told of their fine Chris-
tian devotions.
"I believe that he is a Chris-
tian and is favorable to every-
thing we can do to help Chris-
tianize his people," the report
reads.

Chocolate is on the "can't be
found" list — and Mr. Killman
states that he misses it very
much — just for diversity from
the regular food.

Most of the sermons are
spoken through interpreters and,
according to the letter, the
group's getting the word across
to the natives very successfully.
"After we speak, we pass out
gospels of John to all those pre-
sent and let them follow along
as we bring to them the Word
of Life," his report states.

The Gospel of John was se-
lected because it is the only
gospel translated into the na-
tive language there.

The entire mission is part of
a world-wide campaign con-
ducted by the Youth for Christ
movement. Mr. Killman stated
before he left for overseas.

His family, comprised of his
wife and two daughters, are re-
maining at their Torrance home
while he is abroad.

Sunday Sermon Topic Is Man

Man as the image or reflec-
tion of God has a perfect, ever-
lasting existence, the Sunday
Bible Lesson on "Man" in all
Christian Science churches
points out.

The Golden Text is from
Daniel (10:19): "O man greatly
beloved, fear not: peace be un-
to thee, be strong, yea, be strong."

This verse from 1 John will
read, "For this is the message
that ye have heard from the
beginning, that we should love
one another" (3:11).

Citations from the Christian
Science textbook, "Science and
Health with Key to the Scrip-
tures," by Mary Baker Eddy
include: "It should be thor-
oughly understood that all men have
one Mind, one God, and Father
one Life, Truth, and Love. Man
kind will become perfect in pro-
portion as this fact becomes ap-
parent. War will cease and the
true brotherhood of man will be
established" (p. 467).
