

'STRIP' TO GET SCHOOL ADDITIONS

Locations of 62 new schools to be built, "it" as well as areas in which major school plant alterations will be made through out the city of Los Angeles school system, were made public this week by Superintendent of Schools Alexander J. Stoddard.

The big "it" is this: a proposed \$118,000,000 school bond issue must be approved by the taxpayers in the Los Angeles school system.

Included in the proposal were new elementary schools in east Torrance area, in a south

schools will be purchased when the bonds get the voters' okay. In East Torrance, Dominguez and property for a handicapped children's school in south Gardena.

A new junior high school will be in the office for Dominguez, the land as yet has not been purchased.

In addition, the long-awaited Narbonne High School is proposed, as are new plants in Gardena, Reseda and Westchester. Stoddard said that the additions would practically remedy the overcrowded situation in the city schools, would bring many school plants up to "standard" to meet state building requirements and would strengthen those buildings which were shaken badly in the 1933 earthquake.

All in all, the bond issue would yield \$50,500,000 for elementary schools, \$68,500,000 for high schools and \$17,000,000 for junior colleges. An additional \$12,000,000 would go to bring structures up to standard.

February building permit totals boomed to more than \$3,000,000 in valuation to bring the "to-date" total far ahead of the same 1951 period, the building department revealed this week.

Although February is the shortest month of the year, permits for \$3,191,922 were written by the Torrance department. The total for January-February in 1951 was only \$2,519,760.
