Health Chats

Aids to Better Digestion

ESAR'S Comic Dictionary defines the abdomen as "a bowl-shaped cavity that contains the organs of indigestion." It is said that all humor contains an element of fact. If this is true, it would seem that the fact-element in the above-quoted definition is that some people are more familiar with indigestion than with normal digestion.

Let us briefly consider what digestion is and what part it plays in the ability of the body to make full use of the food we eat. We shall then better understand the importance of good digestion and the importance of doing our best to promote it by eating in a wise manner.

After food is taken into the body it undergoes several changes before it is completely used up. First, it is mixed with secretions of the mouth, stomach, and small intestine and is reduced to a semi-liquid state. This is merely a preparation of the food for the use by the body. And this preparatory step is called digestion.

Then comes a second step in which the liquid food filters through the lining of the stomach and intestine into the blood stream, to be distributed to the millions of cells in all parts of the body. The second step is called absorption.

Now the body cells pick up and make use of the food material which has been brought to them by the blood stream. This third step is called assimilation. Thus the body derives no nutrition from the food we eat until this third stage is reached.

1. Food should be chewed thoroughly before it is swallowed. The habit of eating hurriedly, of gulping half-chewed food, certainly does not promote good digestion.

2. For best digestion food should be tasty. It has been proved scientifically that tasty foods are conducive to good digestion.

3. Food should be eaten in moderate amount. A person should never feel "stuffed" at the end of a meal.

4. It is better to eat a few foods, rather than a large variety, at a meal.

5. It is an aid to digestion, not to do heavy physical work immediately after a meal.

6. The mind should be free of unpleasant thoughts during a meal. Heated arguments and emotional upsets have caused many a case of indigestion. Pleasant thoughts and pleasant conversation are friends of good digestion.

7. Restoration of the mechanical integrity of the body to assure normal nerve function is a "must" to achieve better digestion.

Follow the above suggestions and note a gradual improvement in your own health picture.
