The streets and buildings of old London are unlike those in America. Yet people from Torrance and other American cities who take advantage of low tourist fares offered by major airlines this summer will find that the people are pretty much like themselves.

New Trans-Atlantic Airline Coaches To Put Europe Within Everyone's Reach

Piccadilly, the Champs Elysees, even Rome's Via Veneto truly will become an extension of Torrance's Sartori Ave. and other cities' Main Sts. this summer. Gates of international travel will be opened wide to nearly all Americans when Trans-Atlantic air tourist fares are established about May 1.

Two historic factors which have thus far curbed global jumping, namely, time and money, will be lessened greatly by the new low cost fares.

Not only will the rates give added impetus to global travel, but they should cement more closely international understanding and goodwill by making it possible for Average America to get to know Average Britain and Average Europe.

Let's take a hypothetical tourist from Torrance who earns \$5000 a year. His two-week vacation and his medium income have made it necessary for him to get impressions of Europe strictly from the local theater or his TV screen. Now he's able to go to Europe and see for himself.

An all-inclusive tour will be jointly offered by TWA and Thomas Cook and Son, Inc. beginning May 1. Costing \$618 from New York, the tour will encompass the London area, with the price including transportation, meals, lodging and sight-seeing.

Round trip fares on the coach airlines are also within easy reach of many pocketbooks. On season (May 1 to November this year, April 1 to November thereafter) round-trip rates from New York to Shannon are \$431.80, to London are \$486 and to Paris are \$522. Off-season (winter) charges are considerably less.

In London Mr. Torrance will scan the twisting narrow streets,

gaze upon Westminster Bridge and Big Ben, take side trips to Oxford and the Shakespeare country and, perhaps, visit a few of the quaint old lodging houses so often described in English literature.

Paris will find him struggling to recall his rusty French, perhaps confiding to a passerby "My book is on the table," the first sentence he remembers from French II at Torrance High.

All the romantic places of France will be within his grasp. He'll be able to visit Versailles, see Paris,

the Eiffel Tower, the Louvre and the Arch Triomphe. The picture he's always had of sipping aperitifs in a sidewalk cafe will become reality—he can go to French night clubs and hear the Paris opera.

All airlines which will offer reduced rate service will use their present modern, high standard and airlines, modified to conform from French II at Torrance High. Round-trip flights each day, four times will be within his grasp. He'll be able to visit Versailles, see Paris,

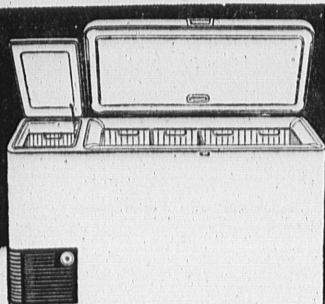
