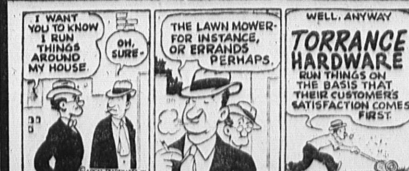

The reason being that the local American Legion Post, Bert S. Crossland Post 170, has currently locked bayonets with a North Long Beach post in a membership contest.

The losing Legion post has to cook up a banquet for the post which has enlisted the most members by March 31. It isn't the banquet the local post minds so much—it is the K. P. afterward.

"We need 26 more members between now and Monday to fill our quota," claims Vice-Commander Harry Green. "We'll need more than that if we want to win this contest," he said. To encourage local ex-servicemen to join the Torrance post, the Legionnaires will erect a recruiting booth in front of the Bank of America and will man it all day Saturday.

Prospective Legionnaires are invited to inspect the Legion Hall at 1109 Border Ave. any time Saturday. A "recruiting sergeant" will be available.

Membership in the Legion is available to any ex-serviceman who served in the armed forces between April 16, 1917, and Nov. 11, 1918, or from Dec. 7, 1941, to Sept. 2, 1945. Veterans of the Korean war are now eligible for membership in the Legion.

Initiation fee is \$5, of which \$2.75 is used for the rehabilitation of veterans. The initiation fee also entitles members to receive the national and state Legion magazines.

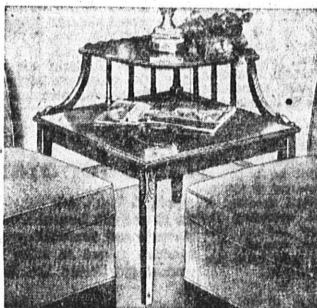

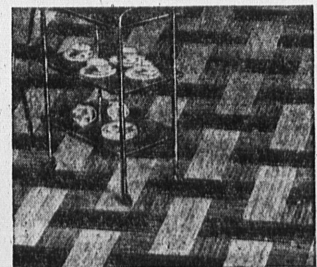

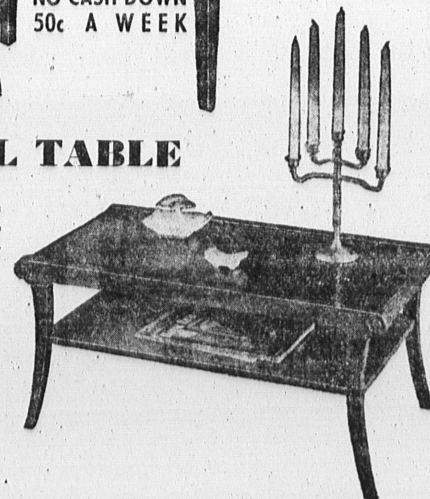
