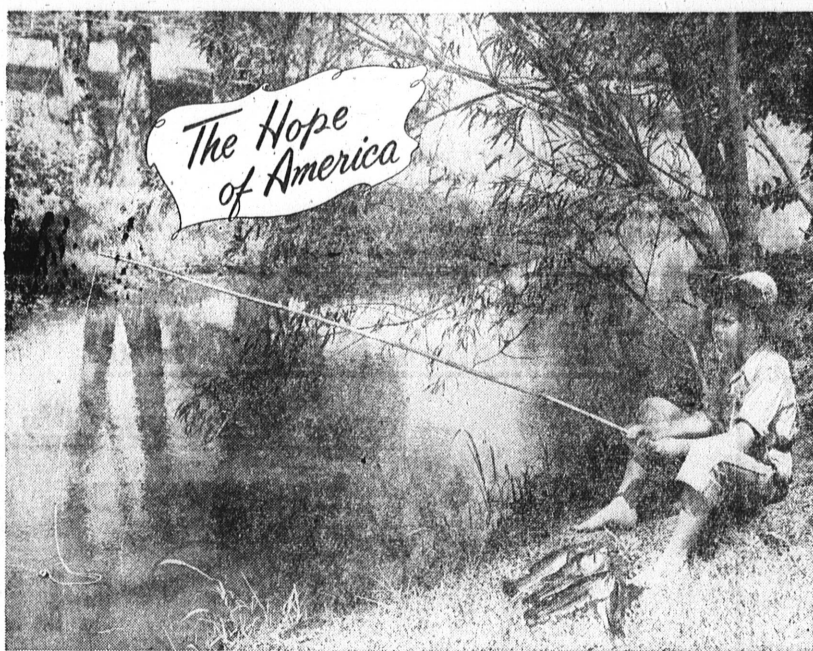

Rev. Killman May Preach to Aborigine Tribespeople

The Rev. J. R. Killman, traveling with a Youth for Christ group in Formosa, may travel among the aboriginal tribes in the mountains back of Formosa, according to a report received this week.

Mr. Killman stated that he has been asked to go with an interpreter to these tribespeople where no white man ever has gone and speak to them. There are more than 750 Christians among the tribesmen, he said, in a thriving church begun only recently by a native convert.

However, his report reads, he has made tentative plans to return to the states, leaving Formosa next Tuesday, but if sufficient funds are supplied he will obtain the necessary passes to allow the journey.

The Youth for Christ team spoke before students at the Bible Institute in Formosa on its 51st birthday; all those who attended the celebration are young missionaries and pastors, he said.

Assistant pastor of the First Baptist Church here, Mr. Killman is on a six-week mission in the Orient. Information about the missionary work can be obtained from the church, it was stated.

Evangelistic Services to Open Tuesday

Spring Evangelistic Services conducted by Rev. P. L. Liddell will open at the Church of the Nazarene, 1501 W. Carson St., Tuesday night and continue through Easter Sunday, April 13, it was announced yesterday.

Rev. Liddell, of Denver, Colo., is a graduate of Olivet Nazarene College, Kankakee, Ill., and is an accomplished musician, playing the trombone and singing vocal solos.

An Air Force pilot during World War II, the young evangelist was pastor of the Golden, Colo., Nazarene church before entering evangelistic work.

Services here will be held at 7:30 each evening and at 11 a.m. each Sunday.
