**TORRANCE HERALD**  
**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS OF MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT NO. 3 OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,000,000.**

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled "An Act to provide for the formation of districts within municipalities for the acquisition, construction or extension of water works, water systems or water distribution systems, and for the acquisition, construction, extension or payment of bonds of such districts to meet the cost of such water works, water systems or water distribution systems; and for the acquisition, construction or extension of such water works, water systems or water distribution systems," approved April 22, 1922, Stats. 1922, Chap. 223, as amended, and pursuant to Ordinance No. 579 of the City of Torrance, a special municipal election was duly and regularly held on the 10th day of August, 1932, in the territory included within the boundaries of Municipal Water District No. 3 of the City of Torrance, California, as more fully and specifically described in the aforesaid ordinance; and that election resulted in the passage of said Ordinance No. 579, which provides for the following:

**BOND PROPOSITION:** Shall that certain municipal water district known as Municipal Water District No. 3 of the City of Torrance, California, incur a bonded indebtedness in the amount of \$2,000,000, for the purpose of providing for the acquisition and construction of the water works generally described in Ordinance No. 679 of the City of Torrance?

WHEREAS, said proposition received the affirmative vote of an assestment of two-thirds of the qualified electors of said district voting at the election, and all singular requirements of the Constitution and laws of the State of California, and the Charter of the City of Torrance, in the holding of said election, and the City of Torrance is now authorized and empowered to issue the bonds of said district for the amount provided in the aforesaid ordinance, payable out of the funds of said district, to-wit: the proceeds of the taxes levied on the property in said district, and any other revenues as otherwise permitted by law; and

WHEREAS, the public interest and necessity require that bonds in the amount of two million dollars be issued for the purpose of providing for the acquisition and construction of the water works generally described in Ordinance No. 679, to-wit: the acquisition and construction of said water works, including the acquisition and construction of a booster pumping station, pumps and water mains, and the acquisition and construction of a water main connecting station with the existing water mains owned by the City of Torrance; and

(1) The acquisition of a site for and the acquisition and construction of a booster pumping station with 24 inch main thereon, and the acquisition and construction of a water main connecting station with the existing water mains owned by the City of Torrance; and

(2) The acquisition and construction of a 24 inch feeder water main in Crenshaw Boulevard and its proposed southern and southern extension from De Long Boulevard to the proposed 10-million gallon reservoir site;

(3) The acquisition and construction of a 24 inch pump and equipment at a location approximately 800 feet south of the intersection of York Avenue and 144th Street, and the acquisition and construction of a water main connecting station with the existing water mains owned by the City of Torrance; and

(4) The acquisition and construction of a 24 inch water main in portions of the proposed district to extend the water distribution system owned by and now existing in the City of Torrance; and

(5) The acquisition of existing water mains now owned by the City of Torrance, and located in Southern California and located approximately as follows:

On 144th Street from Western Avenue to Crenshaw Boulevard and on Crenshaw Boulevard from 190th Street to De Long Boulevard.
