Cook lost seven birds last week, but one of them, a homing racer, flew home two days after it was taken.

Torrance Detective Sgt. Percy Bennett said that the job evidently is the work of a teen-aged youth and asks the cooperation of all pigeon fanciers in helping to nab the thief.

Bennett said that the birds, Blondinettes and other rare varieties, are all banded and registered with a national bird association. Any effort to sell the birds would be virtually useless, Bennett warned.

Any person who sees another attempting to sell a rare racing homer, or any valuable bird, is asked to call the police department.
