# County Adopts Tree Ordinance

A new ordinance covering removal of roadside trees in unincorporated areas was adopted by the Board of Supervisors Tuesday, which will require closer supervision in order to preserve the beauty of the county streets.

Supervisor Raymond V. Darby presented the matter to the Board in September, when a county employee gave a permit for removal of some forty palm trees along South Broadway in the vicinity of 140th St. Six of eight trees had been removed before Darby learned of the action and immediately took steps to have them replanted.

The new ordinance requires replacing trees so removed by trees of a type or quality determined by the director of Parks and Recreation, to whom application for removal of all trees in county area must be filed.

# Immunizations In Area Schools To Continue

Immunizations against diphtheria and tetanus are continuing to be scheduled in the local schools, it was announced this week by Dr. Jules Comroe, Torrance District Health Officer.

The program is conducted jointly by personnel of the County Health Department and the school system.

This double immunization shot against diphtheria and tetanus is available to all school children through 12 years of age. However, they must have the written consent of their parents before receiving the protection.

The next schools to be visited are Orange School Oct. 23, and the Lomita and Nativity schools, Oct. 28.

# Hen Raising Topic at EC

New genetic concepts in poultry breeding were discussed at El Camino College Tuesday night as Dr. S. S. Munro, research scientist with the Western Cooperative Hatcheries of Bellevue, Wash., spoke to a large group.

An expert on study of the over-dominance theory of heterosis, or hybrid vigor, Dr. Munro said:

"The over-dominance theory holds that the first generation of a strain or breed cross may possess livability, growth rate, fertility and other desirable qualities to a greater degree than either of its parents, and that this increased vigor is due to interaction of unlike genes—a situation which cannot be repeated in a second generation."
