Torrance's 16,807 registered voters have 56 polling places at which to cast their ballots in Tuesday's general election, according to a final corrected list released by the registrar of voters.

Six of the 56 numbered precincts have been split in order to cut down the burden of tallying 488 or more votes in one precinct. The divisions occur in precincts 11, 20, 25, 34, 35 and 41.

## Liquor License Hearing Stated For Wednesday

A protest and an appeal on an application for an off-sale liquor license at 14312 Hawthorne Blvd. will be heard Wednesday by the State Board of Equalization in Room 551 of Bldg. 307 & 311 St. Louis Avenue.

The application was made by Harold Patterson of Torrance and was denied by the board at its Sept. 28 meeting on the grounds that the premises are in the immediate vicinity of a children's public playground.

Patterson appealed the original decision of the board, and subsequently a protest on the same grounds cited in the denial was filed by Rev. and Mrs. A. S. Rainwater, 24411 Hawthorne Blvd. Waltham.

Either of two board referees, Joseph C. Akers or George K. Edwards, will conduct the hearing. Findings will be forwarded to the state liquor administrator in Sacramento for review and presentation to the Board of Equalization at its Nov. 20 meeting. The board will take final action.
