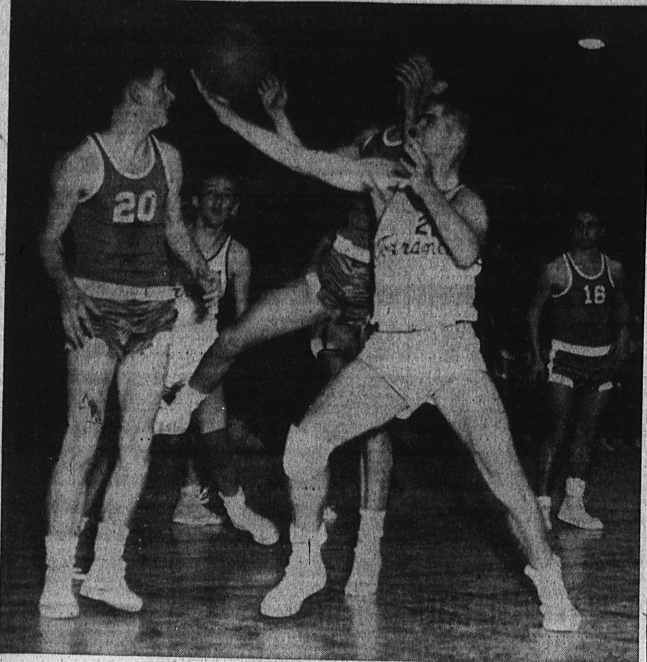


# Seahawks Pace League as Normans Drop Tartars

## Tartars Run Gold in First Home Contest

The Tartars, like hotel faucets, run hot and cold. Friday night was cold.

Meeting the Beverly Hills Normans for their first league game at home, the Tartars potted only 12 per cent of their shots to lose the game 50-33. Of the 64 shots made from the floor, the Tartars hit only eight.

Leading the victors was guard Don Zueker, who sank 18 points. Bob Moon led Torrance scoring with nine points to his credit. The game belonged to the visitors throughout the second half. The Normans led 21-20 at half-time.

Missing the Friday night action was guard Harold Phillips, who was sidelined with the flu. Playing his first game of the year was Leo Valencia, who has been out with a broken thumb since early in the season. Although a top-flight ball handler, Valencia hadn't played enough with the team to fill Phillips' shoes against the speedy Beverly Hills quintet.

Billy Sommers, usually a strong point maker on the forward wall, wound up the evening with five points while his running mate, Jerry Farrar, was credited with two.

In the preliminary struggle, the Beverly Hills lightweights set up the Tartarbabes with a 48-40 defeat. Torrance led 21-15 at the halftime, only to see their lead fade away in the third quarter under the fast-breaking Beverly Bees.

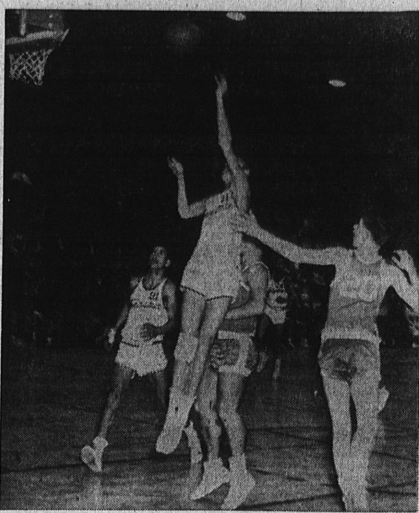

## John A. Willd Passes Bar Exam

John A. Willd, 17216 Eastwood Ave., is among 507 candidates passing the October, 1952 bar examination, the Committee of Bar Examiners of the State Bar of California revealed last week.

Willd will be certified by the committee to the Los Angeles Supreme Court for admission at ceremonies before the court on Jan. 28, along with other successful candidates from this area.

Of the 953 persons who took the examination, 53.2 per cent passed. This percentage is higher than the average percentage passing in fall examinations since 1933, which is 45.3 per cent.
