Funeral services will be held Tuesday, 2 p.m., at Stone and Myers Chapel with the Rev. Arthur E. Bello, rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, officiating. Interment will follow at Green Hills Cemetery.

Highway Patrol Chalks Up Busy Year During '52

California Highway Patrolmen ties reached an all-time high, 439,324, a 21 cent increase over halted about one out of every A total of 681,121 citations and 1951. Preliminary analysis of enforcement figures indicates that the Patrol's enforcement activity, with citations alone running

speeding, the state's No. 1 traffic killer, accounted for one third of all arrests. Officers chalked up 25,046,071 miles during the year, an average of more than 20,000 miles for each of the patrol's 1200 traffic officers. Trucks figured prominently in the enforcement picture. Officers made 751,957 commercial vehicle inspections which resulted in 77,737 arrests and the writing of 53,702 warnings. The Patrol also disclosed that more than 9500 arrests for drunk driving were made in 1952, a 13 per cent hike over 1951.
