

YMCA Campaign At 29 Per Cent Of Annual Goal

The YMCA current support campaign has raised only 29 per cent of the \$13,000 quota so far, it was reported last week by Stan Roberts, executive secretary of the local YMCA.

Leading the volunteers in the drive is the industrial division under Robert I. Plomert Jr., which has turned in \$2097.50.

Charles Mullen's commercial division has turned in \$983, Don Hitchcock's professional division \$217.87, and the field division, headed by Art Sielaff and Harry Harper, \$276. Total to date is \$3076.37.

The drive is scheduled to end Tuesday, Feb. 24.

More Money Due For Water Tests In West Basin

A portion of the \$232,000 remaining from the \$750,000 originally appropriated for the Manhattan Beach experiment to prevent sea water intrusion was reallocated at last Friday's State Water Resources Board meeting to three different services.

Largest lump sum, \$80,000, went to the Los Angeles County Flood Control District to carry the injection project through June 30 of this year. Additional \$5000 sums were given to continue research at UCLA and to the Division of Water Resources for supervisory services.

The Board also decided not to approve, at this time, extending the barrier test beyond July 1 of this year, pending a study of preliminary results obtained by that date.

Consideration of terms under which the city of Hawthorne annexation would be acceptable was deferred until the Feb. 24 meeting.

C. A. Griffith chairman of the California State Water Resources Board, will speak on water problems under consideration of the board at the Feb. 28 meeting of the West Basin Water Association Board of Directors, to be held at the Palos Verdes Country Club.

A report of progress in settling West Basin litigation will be made at the Association meeting.
