Darwin Parrish, chairman of the commission, led Wednesday's discussion, warning that if something were not done this year there would be no recreation in Torrance. The entire program would bog down because of lack of funds, he said.

Citing Seaside Ranchos, North Torrance, and Hollywood Riviera

as examples, Patronsky told the need for additional play areas as well as expanded programs at areas now in use.

Near Schools

Wherever possible, he added, the new areas would be adjacent to school grounds so there would be no duplication of facilities.

Arthur Sues, of 1734 W. 234th St., who the night before told the council he favored turning the entire recreation program

over to the school system for administration, also stressed the need for expanded facilities.

No School Money

Judge John A. Shiden, president of the Board of Education, said yesterday that on prior occasions the Board had indicated it was unable to take over recreation because of insufficient funds. On those occasions, the board concurred that it was a city problem which should be handled by the city, he said.

Education dollars should be spent first for books, desks, and

schoolhouses, the president emphasized. When these needs are filled, any remaining funds could be used for recreation, he said.
