The Salvation Army, a ponprofit organization, helps lessen the tax-load by providing for men who otherwise would be required to seek county or state aid. Brigadier Gifford said. He reported that the center has continuing need for discarded clothing, furniture, bedding, dishes, shoes, toys, stoves, radios, appliances, brica-brac, bicycles, Tugs, rags and miscellancous items.

Chairman Sherfey urged Torrance 3634 during the campaign to bring a Red Shield truck to home or office to collect discards.
