Salvage Week Campaign Will Start Monday

Those familiar Salvation Army Red Shield trucks will visit homes here next Monday through Saturday to collect castoff articles contributed in the annual Torrance Salvage Week campaign.

Reconditioning of the articles in workshops of the Salvation Army Social Service Center provide a social rehabilitation program for hundreds of needy and handicapped men.

Brigadier Ranson D. Gifford, manager of the center, said last year's donations provided 258,000 hours of occupational therapy, 59,922 meals, 21,110 lodgings and substantial financial assistance.

"All receipts from sale of re-furnished materials above operating costs are returned in the form of cash grants to the unfortunate men who daily, through the center seeking help," Brigadier Gifford said.

He pointed out that the non-profit organization helps lessen the tax load by providing for men who otherwise would be compelled to seek county or state aid.

Discarded but still usable materials needed continuously by the center include clothing, furniture, home appliances, radios, bedding, dishes, shoes, toys, stoves, bric-a-brac, bicycles, rugs, rags and miscellaneous items.

J. Hugh Sherkey Jr., chairman of the Torrance Salvage Week committee, urged local residents to telephone Torrance 3684 during the campaign to bring a Red Shield truck to home or office to collect discards.
