Valley Odds-On Favorites to Cop Metro Track Nod

Valley Junior College's powerful spike squad is favored to win the Metropolitan Conference track championship Saturday night on Santa Monica's Valley Field. Finals are scheduled for 7:30 p.m., with preliminaries slated for 2 p.m.

The classy Monarchs, boasting a standout in every running event, captured the league dual meet title. East Los Angeles and Santa Monica are expected to give Jim Slosson's Valley team its toughest test.

Prime interest will be focused on Samojec's giant Mason Ben, who as he attempts to better his own national junior college shot put mark of 53 ft. 6 1/2 in. Another threat to a national jaycee standard is East Los Angeles' great high jumper, Elroy Jeter. Having already cleared 6 ft. 7 7/8 in. and been a consistent performer over 6 ft. 5 in., Jeter is a threat to "Corny" Johnson's 6 ft. 8 3/8 in. mark.

Valley figures to pile up plenty of points in the sprints from Bill McCormick, the 440 and 220 yarder, from the distances with Bill Taylor and Joe Leach, and the pole vault with Ed Lafferly.

Sherwin Sosnovsky of East Los Angeles, who whipped the discus 150 ft. 2 in. last week, is another standout to watch.
