Optimists Name Theme of Annual Club Convention

"The Power of Optimism" has been selected as the theme of the four-day 35th annual convention of Optimist International, Scheduled to take place in Washington, D. C., June 17-20, the convention will be attended by 2500 delegates representing 800 Optimist clubs with a membership of 40,000.

"Never before has there been such a need for optimism as an expression of affirmative faith in life as in today's restless and troubled world," says J. Warren Day, president of Optimist International.

District oratorical contests are now being conducted among boys throughout the nation by Optimist clubs, and winners in each of the 27 districts will appear in Washington during the convention to compete in the finals for college scholarships of \$1000, \$750 and \$500.

Active as "Friend of the Boy," Optimist clubs maintain boys' homes and ranches in 19 different localities, aided half a million boys during the past year in full or part-time projects. Over \$1,500,000 was allocated for these projects last year.

The annual election of officers will be held during the convention in the nation's capital.
