**Everlasting Punishment Is Lesson-Sermon**

Can the ability to understand man as inseparable from his heavenly Father be gained and a mis-spent life corrected? Yes, declares the Sunday lesson-sermon on "Everlasting Punishment" in all Christian Science churches.

The Golden Text from Hebrews (12:11) reads, "No chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous; nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them which are exercised thereby."

In a parable recorded by Luke (15:13, 14, 17, 20-24) Jesus describes the prodigal son, who "took his journey unto a far country and there wasted his substance with riotous living" and "began to be in want." And when he came to himself, "... he arose and came to his father..." And the son said unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight... But the father said to his servants, Bring forth the best robe, and put it on him; and let us eat and be merry; for this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.

Mary Baker Eddy writes in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures": "The sharp experience of belief in the suppositious life in matter, as well as our disappointment and ceaseless woes, turn us like tired children to the arms of divine Love. Then we began to learn Life in divine Science." (p. 322).
