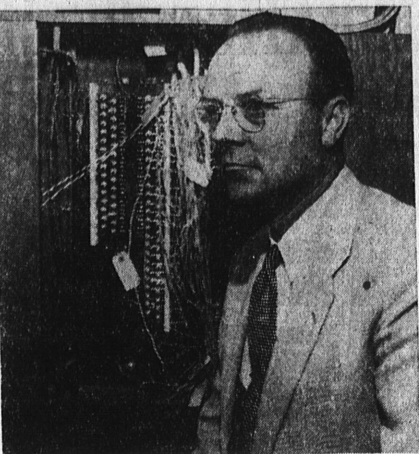

Local Women Hurt in Crash
