After being thoroughly baked, each flower is cleaned carefully and trimmed ao it will lay flat. The blossoms are then arranged in bouquet fashion, secured with transparent guess in an airtight frame. The noted hobbyist will display many of her pictures at Wednesday's meeting, which will be preceded by a dessert luncheon. Reservations to attend may be made through any mem-ber of the Garden Club.
