El Camino Dumps Santa Monica for Fifth Metro Win

Herring Guarded by Three Men, Held to Seven Points

Breaking loose for 18 big points in the fourth period, while leading Santa Monica to 11, El Camino College tucked away its fifth straight Metropolitan Conference victory Friday night by dumping Santa Monica 75-66.

Going into the final period the score read 54-51. Leading Metro scorer Allen Herring was held to a measly even points, probably because three Santa Monica men did nothing but guard him all night. The win kept El Camino in first place. Long Beach also won out, remaining a game out in second. It marked the fourth time the Warriors had won a league victory on their home floor this season. It was the "comeback" of Bill Baron that led EC to top Santa Monica short of an upset. Baron, who sat out the first three loop games, scored 4 points.

Trailing Baron in the scoring rank were Chuck Baker, 16 and John Nethercott, 14. Tuesday night East Los Angeles will meet the Warriors on EC's floor. Game-time is set for 7 p.m.
