### Girl Scouts Offer Army "Dog Tags" For Identification in Accidents

Army "dog tags" will soon appear in Torrance civilian life. In co-operation with police and civil defense authorities here, Girl Scout Troop 1293 of Madrona Neighborhood is offering all residents the opportunity of purchasing identification tags for their children, themselves, or other members of the family.

"As you know," said Mrs. Carl Osterlind, troop leader, "many accidents happen to children. In many instances the police have been unable to locate the child's address. This has not only caused the parents much needless worry but has hindered assistance to the child."

"Because of the widespread need for this protection and at the suggestion of many parents, our Girl Scouts are distributing identification tags."

Each tag is made of stainless steel in conformity with Civil Defense Bulletin No. 52. It is about 1 1/2 inches long by 9/16 inches wide, with rounded corners, and is .047 inches thick. Because it will withstand very high temperatures without melting, it will prove invaluable in case of fire or other disaster. The child's name, street number, city, state, and telephone number are permanently indented on the tag in easily read 1/16 inch letters. Washing the tag with soap and water will keep it clean and bright.

The tag comes complete with an 18-inch nickel silver ball and chain. This chain, while strong and durable, has a connecting link that will pull apart at 10 pounds pull; this is to avoid the possibility of strangulation. Doubled up and worn at the wrist, it makes a unique and different charm bracelet.

Order blanks for the tags will be distributed at Torrance schools Monday and also will be available at local doctors' offices. Blanks are to be returned to a Girl Scout at the school, self-addressed envelope to G. S. Troop 1293, 2913 Sonoma Ave., Torrance, Calif. The blanks also may be obtained by writing to this address.

Price of each "dog tag" is 60 cents, and new chains will be available throughout the school year at 10 cents each.

"It's only 60 cents," Mrs. Osterlind said, "but it may save a life!" Mrs. Paul Brunner assists Mrs. Osterlind in leading the troop.
