Red Cross Fund Drive Jumps To 42 Per Cent

Red Cross collections here took a jump from 27 to 42 per cent during last week with the residential section of the campaign accounting for the highest percentage—\$2,323 of a \$4000 goal, or 58 per cent.

The Commerce and Industry drive stands at 38 per cent with \$5,378 of its \$9,000 goal collected and business trails with \$412 of a \$1,425 quota, or 29 per cent. It was announced this week at the regional Red Cross report meeting.

The entire Southwest Region showed a \$29,778 jump last week to \$45,735 of its \$91,300 goal—about 50 per cent.

The region is aiming at a goal of 65 per cent by tomorrow with 100 per cent by April 2. A victory luncheon, honoring 100 per centers, is being planned for that day.

Leaders in the Southwest Region are collectors in Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills and Portuguese Bend, who have gotten 83 per cent of their quota. Inglewood-Lennox stands next with 59 per cent.
