Men of sound minds and great vision planned the beautiful city of Mooseheart, not for themselves or their own children, but for the children of others less fortunate—for children who had lost one or both parents.)

Living conditions of the children at Mooseheart are like those in a fine American home. Small groups live in modern, homelike surroundings—not in dormitories. Visitors to this unusual community are always impressed with the fraternal accomplishment in making Mooseheart as little like an institute as possible.

Education
From the time they are tiny tots in the "Baby Village" until their graduation from high school, Mooseheart youngsters receive the advantages of the finest medical care, ample recreation facilities, the best in education and useful vocational training and competent adult guidance. Upon graduation from Mooseheart, each student is well equipped to fill a useful job and to become a credit to the community in which he lives. Instruction is provided in more than twenty practical and useful trades. The many athletic and community activities at Mooseheart are prime examples of the manner in which Mooseheart children are taught to work together for the good of all.

Religion
Every student is morally trained for life in the religious faith which prevailed in his former home. That this religious guidance has a profound influence in character building is supported by the excellent record

Enlistment In All Branches Of Army Approved

For the first time since 1943, direct enlistments for all branches of the U. S. Army are now possible, according to M/Sgt Edward F. Corbett of the San Pedro Army and Air Force Recruiting Station.

This major change of policy will be welcomed by all applicants who heretofore have been unable to receive a pre-enlistment guarantee. Previously, only men with prior military service and selected high school graduates could be promised a definite assignment upon enlistment. Now, all fields of Army service are available: Transportation Corps, Armor, Ordnance, Quartermaster Corps, Signal Corps, Chemical Corps and many others.

Sgt. Corbett expects a steady stream of young men to apply under the provisions of this new regulation.

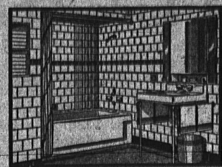

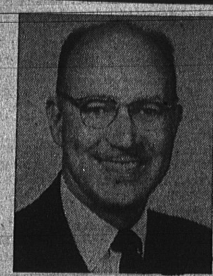
