Child Should Be Caution Sign To Motorists—CHP

A child near the street is a caution sign.

California Highway Patrol Commissioner B. R. Caldwell said today that any child playing near a street or highway should be an automatic warning signal to motorists to slow down and proceed with caution.

"The greatest single killer of children under 15 years of age in our country today is the traffic accident," Caldwell declared.

Pointing out that children are usually willing to follow the example of others, Caldwell said that a youngster who exhibits a disregard of traffic regulations often mirrors the training or lack of training, that he has received in the home. Careless habits in walking, wild play in moving cars or leaning out of car windows always reflect a lack of proper safety training in children.

"It is the responsibility of every parent to educate children to the dangers that are always present in traffic," Caldwell said. "It is equally important that these same parents practice safe driving and walking behavior that will save the lives of unway youngsters. Failure of too many motorists to stop for flashing red lights on school buses and disregard of speed limits all take a tragic annual toll in young lives."
