'Y' TO TAKE 170 BOYS TO CAMPS THIS SUMMER

The Torrance YMCA will take 170 boys of this area to camps in the San Bernardino and High Sierra mountains this summer, Executive Secretary Stan Roberts announced this week.

He said the branch has received schedules and information folders from the Los Angeles YMCA's camp offices and will start taking applications immediately.

The program includes an eight-day trip for boys from 9 to 14 years old, and one eight-day trip for boys 12 to 16 years.

First group will be at Round Meadow in the San Bernardino mountains July 13-20. There will be room for 140 youngsters, 9 to 14.

The unique High Sierra Caravan trip will leave with 30 campers July 29 and return Aug. 5. Itinerary of the 1000 mile trip includes stops at Mammoth Lakes, Bodie ghost town, Tuolumne Meadows and Yosemite. Youngsters 12 to 16 will do their own cooking and sleep under the stars.

Roberts said local adult volunteer leaders and YMCA staffers will accompany the boys on trips to supervise and help them enjoy their vacation. "We hope to have one adult for every seven boys to insure maximum safety," the executive secretary said.

He added, "the broad purpose of YMCA camping is to give boys a constructive, entertaining vacation. The program is based on more than 100 years of YMCA experience in working with youth and helping them become responsible adults."
