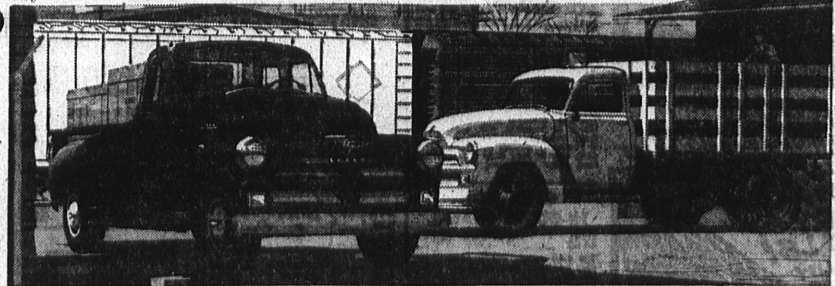

In accordance with the Labor Code of the State of California, the District has ascertained the general prevailing rate of wages for each craft or type of workman needed to execute the contract which will be awarded the successful bidder.

Apprentices may be employed in conformity with Section 1777.5 of the California Labor Code.

It shall be mandatory upon the Contractor to whom the contract is awarded and upon all sub-contractors to whom the contract is awarded, to pay the prevailing wage scale in accordance with the provisions of Section 1770 of the Labor Code, to all workmen employed in the execution of this contract.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish a Labor and Material Bond a Faithful Performance Bond, each in the amount equal to 100% of the contract price. Said bond shall be filed with the Board of Education at the office of the District.

The District reserves the right to reject any and all bids or to waive any irregularities in any bid and to determine the lowest responsible bid. No bidder may withdraw his bid, check, or bid bond for a period of thirty (30) days after the date set for the opening.

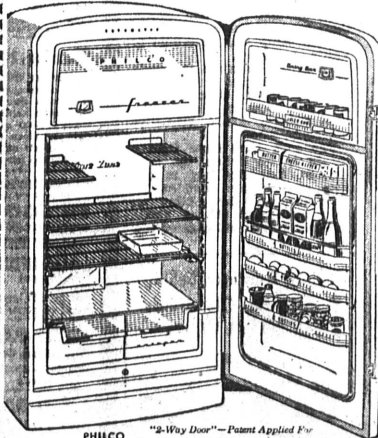
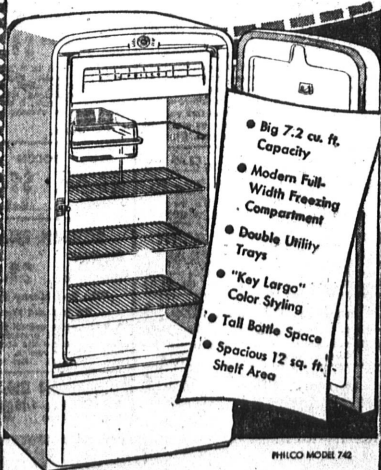
