

### 'Sex Menace' Is Topic Of Bliss Speech



LT. EDWARD N. BLISS  
... To Speak to JC's

"The Sex Menace" will be the topic of a speech by Lt. Edward N. Bliss, chief of the bureau of investigation for the public defender of Los Angeles County, when he addresses the Torrance Junior Chamber of Commerce on July 22 at 7:30 p.m. at the Ding How Cafe.

Lt. Bliss has investigated or supervised the investigation of nearly 10,000 felony cases for the Superior Courts of this county in his official capacity.

He spoke at a meeting of the Torrance Optimists Club last month. Various examples of cases investigated by Lt. Bliss' office will be cited in his speech to the JC's.

Prior to his present job, Lt. Bliss was a Senior Security Specialist with the Arabian Oil

Company in Dhahran, Saudi Arabia and Egypt, and before that was a detective for the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office, assigned to vice and narcotics details.

### Clerks Meet Employers' Council To Discuss Wage Raise Refusal

Representatives of the Retail Clerks Union, Local 905, will meet today with the Harbor Area Employers' Council Committee to discuss the Committee's refusal to grant 10-20 cent per hour wage increases to members of the Union, Frank S. Selover, executive secretary of the Council announced this week.

The Committee's reasons for not granting the wage increases were that the union proposals were not justified by the U. S. cost-of-living figures; that it is inequitable; that no evidence can be given for its support; and that business conditions do not merit an increase.

The Council went on to state that Los Angeles cost-of-living is down since the increase was granted in January 0.1 points for all items, 1.9 points for food, and 1.0 points for apparel.

The meeting will be held today at 2 p.m. in the Council's office. The Employers' Committee will meet alone at 1 p.m. Local members of this committee include Harry Petro, McCown Drug Stores; Edward Raphael, Gary's Jewelry; and Paul Diamond, Gay Shop.

Proposals for wage increases include:

1. A 10 cent per hour increase in all classifications except—
  1. A 15 cent per hour increase for women clerks, other lines;
  2. A 15 cent per hour increase for drug clerks and pharmacists;
  3. A 20 cent per hour increase for hardware, plumbing, and paint clerks;
  4. A 20 cent per hour increase for variety clerks;
  5. A 10 cent per hour increase, based on hours worked weekly, for appliance, furniture and television salesmen, to be applied to the present guarantee of \$74, and the present commission structure to be amended to include the following schedule: 9.85 per cent commission on first \$2000 sales; 5.5 per cent commission on next \$2800 sales; and a 5 per cent commission on sales above \$4800.
- Furniture, television and appliance dealers under the Mercantile contract met Monday and discussed proposals of the Union

in regard to their category of the proposed changes in the Mercantile Contract.
