Plans for North Torrance Drains Given to County

Preliminary plans and specifications for a drain in North Torrance have been submitted to the County Flood Control District, according to City Manager George Stevens. The \$362,600 project is expected to be ready for bids by September.

Meanwhile, plans are being prepared for other drains in the Central Torrance section, and the Walteria district. These probably won't be ready for bids before next year, Stevens indicated. They tie into other drain projects.

All are to be paid from monies voted in a \$179,000 bond issue which was approved last year.
