Mrs. Lorine Harline and daughter Carolyn are visiting friends and relatives in the northern part of the state. The Harline live on Los Codona Ave.

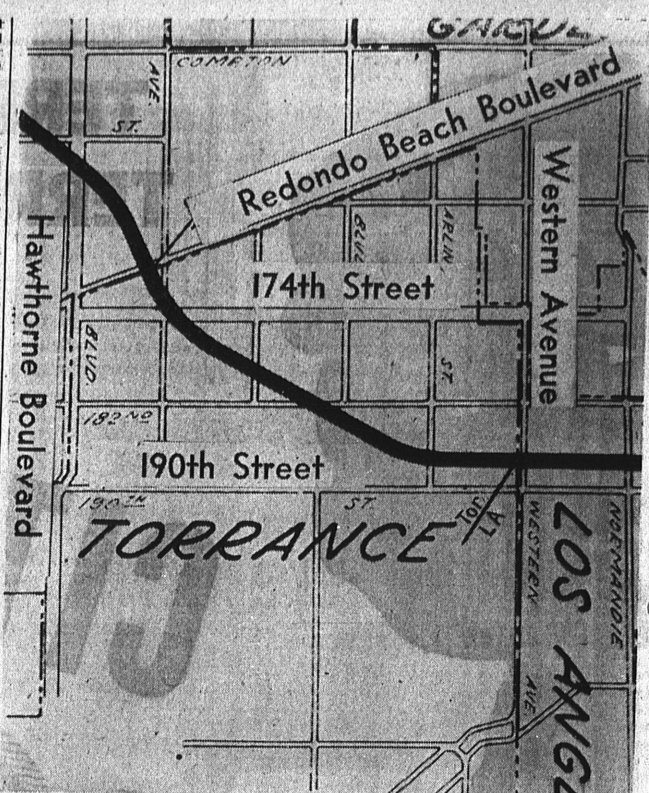

State Having Tough Time With Builders

The State Division of Highways is having difficulty keeping contractors from building on the proposed route of the Sepulveda Freeway.

As late as last Wednesday a state representative appeared before the Torrance Planning Commission to ask the civic body not to rezone a portion of Western Ave. property because it would interfere with the adopted path of the new super-highway.

Recently completed are 28 two-story homes which the builder has discovered will have to be

way. Without going into technical description of the route the new freeway path will enter the City of Torrance crossing Redondo Beach Blvd. slightly west of Prairie Ave. It will swing southwest crossing 174th St. at Prairie Ave. then paralleling 190th St. on its north side crossing Arlington and Western Aves. at right angles.

The freeway travels between Florence Ave. in Inglewood, and dead-ends at the Los Angeles River Freeway near 223rd St.

The resolution adopting the route outlined above was passed by the California Highway Commission at its meeting of February 19 of this year. The state designation for the highway is State Highway Route 158.
