on three requirements set forth by the state:

1. That the auditor has taken the course in school auditing offered by the state.
2. That the auditor has an adequate staff for the job, and
3. That he be experienced in government or school auditing.

The annual audit must account for everything spent by the district. Included also will be an examination of all bank accounts, the tax rate, bonds, an evaluation of construction attendance, an audit of the average daily attendance, insurance coverage, the book store, and other phases of school business.

The Board of Supervisors Tuesday authorized the county counsel to deposit \$428 with the county clerk to secure an order of possession covering the right of way along Lomita Blvd. between Pennsylvania Ave. and the easterly boundary line of Torrance.

## Dressing Wild Hare May Mean Tularemia

Tularemia, or rabbit fever as it is sometimes called, is an infectious disease of particular concern to hunters and their families as well as to others who skin, dress or cook wild rabbits. It is estimated that about 90 per cent of the people who get tularemia get it from handling, cleaning or eating infected wild rabbit and even if rarely fatal, the disease can make a person very ill for several weeks.

Although it is possible to get the disease from other animals or from the bites of ticks and flies, the wild rabbit is the great reservoir of infection from which the disease spreads to other animals and human beings.

The name of this plague-like disease of animals was taken from the California county of Tulare, where the germs (Pasteurella tularensis) were first identified in 1911. At that time the disorder seemed to be limited to the West, but it is now found everywhere in the United States.

As the infected animal is handled, the germs may enter the body through a cut on the hands or arms. So small are these disease organisms, however, that it is possible for them to enter through the unbroken skin. They may also be carried to the eyes, nose or mouth by infected fingers, or enter the intestinal tract through the ingestion of undercooked meat or contaminated water.

A person becomes ill from one to ten days after the germs get into the body—most often symptoms appear on the third day.

The illness starts with chills, fever, body pains and nausea. A sore usually appears at the point where the germs enter the body and nearby lymph glands become swollen and very painful. Severe infection may cause prostration and a high fever over a prolonged period. Permanent immunity follows recovery from an attack.

It just isn't worth taking a chance. When wild rabbits are cooked, cleaned or handled it is advisable to take these precautions:

Wear rubber gloves when dressing or handling any small game animal, especially wild rabbits. Care should be taken that a sharp bone does not pierce the glove.

Do not handle wild rabbits that are found dead.

Destroy all rabbits whose internal organs are studied with small white spots—it may be tularemia.

Shoot only rabbits that are running—slow or sluggish animals may be infected with the disease.

Protect yourself from the bites of flies or ticks (the disease is actually called deer fly fever in some parts of the country).

Cook rabbits thoroughly so that no red meat or blood remains. Do not taste the game or broth until it is well done. Thorough cooking of the meat destroys the germs of tularemia.

A leaflet on tularemia, issued by the U. S. Public Health Service, will be mailed to anyone who sends a card of request to the Los Angeles County Health Department, 241 N. Figueroa.
