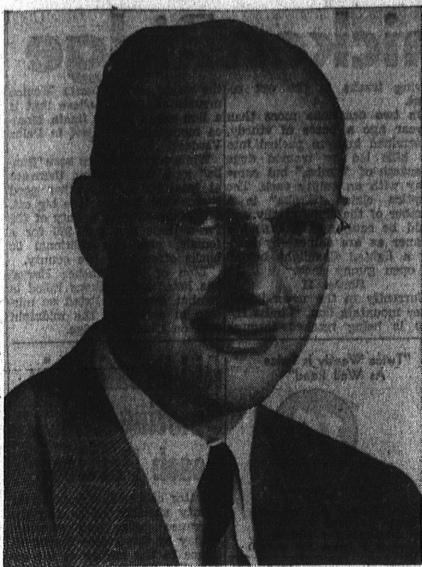

Refinery Manager Heads Chest Drive

A. E. Thompson, general manager of the General Petroleum Refinery here, has been appointed chairman of Torrance's 1953 Community Chest campaign, it was announced yesterday by Jack Dabbs, vice-chairman of the Harbor Area.

Thompson last year served as vice-chairman of the city campaign under Attorney Donald Armstrong. As the new city chairman, he will direct the activities of more than 400 volunteers who will raise funds for 160 separate health and welfare agencies in the Greater Los Angeles area.

During the past two years Torrance has pioneered the one-day blitzkrieg type of campaign. Two years ago the city was the first city in the Los Angeles area to complete a one-day campaign.

Dabbs, manager of the M&M theaters here and the operator of an insurance firm, repeats his assignment as Harbor Area vice-chairman this year. He will have charge of all the organization in the Torrance-Lomita area, according to Harbor Area Chairman William C. Bullock.

LAW IN ACTION

THE IDEA OF A CONTRACT
What would you select as mankind's most useful invention? The wheel? The lever? Material inventions have benefited us richly. But ideas that smooth out human relations and let us live amicably together are beneficial, too.

Many of these ideas which deal with human relations you find in our laws. One of these is the contract.

Basic Idea of a Contract
A contract is an agreement by which two or more persons agree to do something, and from which each expects to benefit. The agreement is enforceable at law, or at least failure to live up to its terms will result in penalties.

Essentials of a Contract
What are the essentials of an ordinary contract? First, each party must be free and able to enter it. Second, each party must perform some part of it. Third, each party must get some benefit—wages, services, etc. Finally, a contract must serve a lawful purpose. You cannot make a valid contract to do a crime or evade the law.

The merit of the idea of a contract lies in its simplicity and its usefulness. Our complex civilization could scarcely work without this simple idea of a plan of action enforceable at law.
