Trio Named as Cum Laude Grads

As one out of every eight graduates to receive the bachelor's degree with honors from the University of Southern California last June, special recognition for above-average grades was received by Harry Robert Hammond, 1325 1/2 Arlington Ave.; Robert Allen Carrow, 913 Madrid Ave.; and John McDonald Wren, 17220 S. Crenshaw Blvd., cum laude graduates.

A recent survey by Howard Patmore, registrar, shows that 12.8 per cent of the total earnings the bachelor's degree had a B or better average for four years.

Cum laude honors were won by 168 students for a B average. Forty-nine graduated magna cum laude for a B-plus record and two had an almost perfect record with A-minus.

Of the total of 3112 June graduates, 1784 men and women earned the bachelor's degree, from which the scholastic records were obtained.
