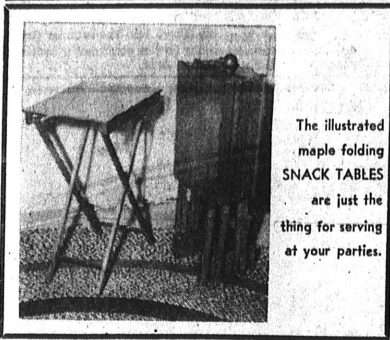

**Shoestring Paving Due**

A contract for paving of streets in the 221st St. and Harvard Blvd. improvement district has been awarded to the R. C. Griffith Co. by the Board of Public Works on its bid of \$58,128.98. It was announced yesterday.

To be paved are 221st St. from Normandie to Western Ave., Harvard Blvd. from Carson St. to 221st St., and Halldale Ave. from 220th St. for one and one-half blocks to the middle of the 22100 block.

The bid was 10 per cent below engineers' estimates, according to Councilman John S. Gibson Jr. The improvements have been planned for several years, Gibson said.

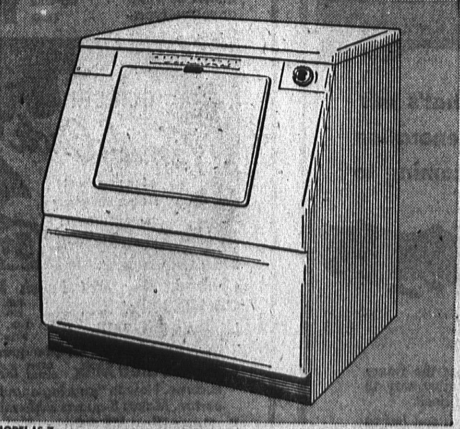

**Second Group Of Ellinwood Tract Starts**

Another group of homes for the Ellinwood development along Pacific Coast Hwy. west of Walters were due for construction immediately as the city's building department prepared yesterday to issue permits for 20 more homes to the developer.

During September, permits totaling more than \$2,500,000 have been issued, according to Walter Bradford in the building department.

The Ellinwood homes, second batch to be started in the huge 1300-home tract, will be valued at approximately \$1,000,000, he said.

With three months to go, all indications are that the city will have no trouble reaching the \$25 million mark in building this year.
