The city government shortly must come to a decision on parking meters. Wherever the subject has come up in thousands of American communities it has touched off controversy between factions of thought, for or against.

Torrance has a parking problem and, despite sound fiscal policies in the management of the city, it has a city revenue problem. Considered opinion by experts lends credence to the conclusion that parking meters can go a long way toward solving both. There are few cases on record where parking meters have been removed after they have been given a fair trial. That is one of the best arguments for them.

The new County youth center will give proper care, housing and rehabilitation facilities for an additional 200 teen-agers. This is more than the number now locked in the County Jail. The cost is a fraction of the price the

Youngsters without criminal records are being locked in the County Jail with criminals and perverts while they wait for juvenile court hearings and studies to determine what is to become of them.

Some are just average kids in trouble; some are homeless; others are being detained because of dangerous home conditions, Still others are under investigation for serious

others are under investigation for serious erimes.

A growing number of youths must be turned loose by authorities to continue law-breaking because the jail and all other facilities are too crowded.

Such intolerable conditions as these provide a "Crime School" which only adds to the juvenile problem.

They mean heartbreak for the minor offenders, primarily detained because they are homeless, deserted or have been treated critelly by adults.

They mean that petfy violators without previous records learn how to be a "big-shot criminals," infecting the neighborhood to which they return.

Law enforcement is hampered by lack of facilities for detaining youthful law violators while their cases and associates are investigated.

Passage of Proposition "A" on the June 8 ballot will relieve these dangerous and inhuman conditions.



Depth of Controversy DOUBLE PURPOSE: It is

clear now that the term "Army-McCarthy controversy" was a misnomer and the the more McCarthy controversy" was a misnomer and the the more accurate term is the Administration-McCarthy controversy. Call it what you will, it actually is a "get McCarthy" campaign in which the administration is strongly aided by the communists and fellow travelers, by the ADA, and by the left wing elements in both parties who are more concerned with making political hay than with rooting out communists.

The scheme behind this controversy is not new. It began with Franklin D. Roosevelt, who threw his 1932 platform overboard upon his inauguration in 1933 and started the development of steadily increasing power for the executive branch of our government. He is completely without the power to prosecute, in dict, or sentence. Yet in trying to create the impression that he has attempted to do so, the president and the attorney general are leaning heavily on what they apparently
