An interim agreement which would limit the amount of water withdrawn from the West Basin will be discussed at a meeting of the executive committee of the West Basin Water Association on Thursday, July 29.

All water producers in the area are invited to attend the meeting, which will be devoted to questions and answers about the plan. Copies of the agreement have been mailed to the area's 472 water producers, including Torrance.

Under the interim agreement, water producers would agree not to draw more water from the basin in one year than the amount which they were assigned in 1949. Officials estimate that 37,000 acre feet of water could be saved each year under this plan.

A steadily falling water table has plagued West Basin development in recent years, due to an overdraft of water by individual producers. There is danger that pressure from the sea

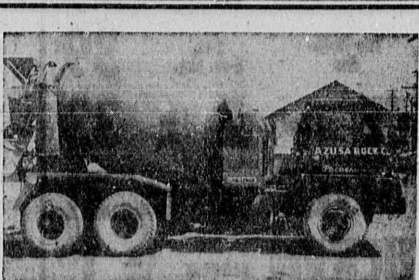
