Los Cancioneros Concert Praised

The spark of pure artistry fired Los Cancioneros' performance last week-end. It was their fourth annual concert, held at Redondo High School auditorium last Saturday and Friday evenings, and it was a triumph.

Under the direction of Riviera Barbara Mabin, the choral group presented a program seemingly deliberately designed to tax their abilities. And yet throughout the numbers, they presented the sureness of tone and note that marks professional skill.

The varied program commenced with the French madrigal "La, La, La Je Ne L'Ose Dire," and proceeded through folk songs, carols, psalms and spirituals that clearly demonstrated the group's versatility. Director Mabin closed the first half of the brilliant performance with a group of choral numbers featuring Rivierans Thorsten Burman, Barbara Merritt and Tom Mabin as soloists.

The second half of the program concerned the fantasy of an ordinary workman. Titled "Three Dreams," it was written and produced by Riviera Ray Wallace. With Los Cancioneros alternately providing background music and moving into the active scenes, the "Three Dreams" sequence featured Andy MacLeod and Margie Jacobsen as the dreamer and dancer respectively.

The exciting "Dreams" set showed the dreamer's hotel room, highlighted by an oversized alarm clock, a corner bed and a giant window behind whose shade the various sets of

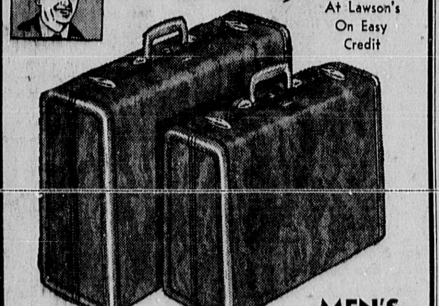
