The lowest bid was offered by the Griffith Co., of Los Angeles, for \$23.108 per square foot. All bids were referred to the Road Department for recommendations.

Approximately one mile of the three-lane roadway would be resurfaced, according to Supervisor Burton W. Chase.

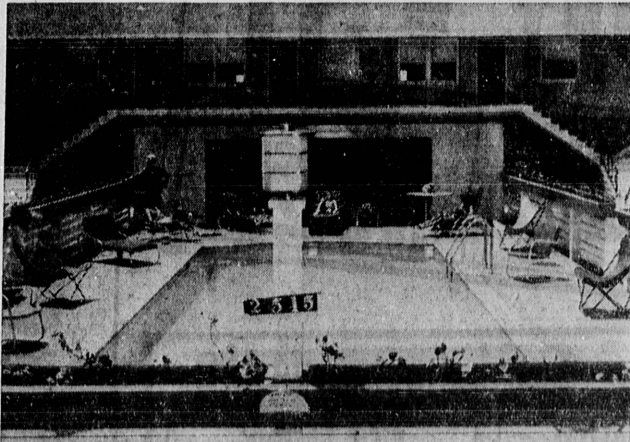
