'Truth' Sunday Lesson Sermon

The Sunday Lesson-Sermon on "Truth" in all Christian Science churches will stress the practical understanding of spiritual law and its ability to overcome bondage and ignorance.

Jesus destroyed for all time the false law of heredity when he healed the man who was born blind. John's Gospel relates that when questioned by his disciples he declared, "Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents; but that the works of God should be made manifest in him." Then "he anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay. And said unto him, Go, wash in the pool of Siloam. . . . He went his way therefore, and washed, and came seeing" (9:3,5,7).

Mary Baker Eddy declares in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures": "Truth casts out all evils and materialistic methods with the actual spiritual law, — the law which gives sight to the blind, hearing to the deaf, voice to the dumb, feet to the lame" (p. 182).

The Golden Text is from Isaiah (25:1): "O Lord, thou art my God; I will exalt thee, I will praise thy name; for thou hast done wonderful things; thy counsels of old are faithfulness and truth."

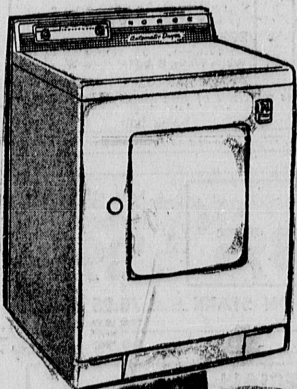
