Seaman Takes Part in War Games Off Coast

Roland J. Goudreaux, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul J. Goudreaux of 17520 Glenburn Ave., served aboard the escort aircraft carrier USS Badoeng Strait, a unit of the invasion force which participated in extensive naval and amphibious "war games" off the coast of Southern California in June.

The escort aircraft carrier was part of a large amphibious task force, comprising approximately 60 ships, 80 aircraft, and 12,000 men. The mission of the task force was to establish and maintain a beachhead on an enemy-held shore, as a base for launching further land operations against the enemy. An aggressor force of U.S. Navy aircraft, submarine, and surface ships acted as the "enemy."
