County Health Official Gives Parents Helpful Rules

Starting to school is an important event in the life of a small child and whether or not it will prove to be a happy one depends, to a large extent, on the child's parents. Other things being equal, a healthy child has a better chance of being happy and successful in school than one who is sickly, and it is the responsibility of his parents to see that he gets the right start.

School days bring with them the greater possibility of exposure to disease. The youngster who starts to school for the first time meets many new children and, because of this, it is wise to make sure that he is protected against the more serious common contagious diseases of childhood. Booster doses of diphtheria and tetanus toxoid are therefore recommended along with revaccination against smallpox if the doctor thinks it advisable.

It is not usually considered necessary to give further protection against whooping cough at this time because the age of greatest danger has already passed. Deaths from whooping cough rarely occur in children over five, while in tetanus half the deaths from this disease occur in children under 15 years of age.

Correct Handicaps

No child should be allowed to start school with a handicap that can be corrected. The doctor should be permitted to discover poor eyesight so that the child's inability to see the blackboard will not retard his learning process and label him dullard.

If a hearing defect has developed, it may be possible to correct it and prevent progressive hearing loss. And if dental care is needed, it is better to have it done before school opens and thus prevent any needless absence.

Many little things can add to the child's feeling of security as he begins his school life. Familiarity with the route he must take to school, particular instruction in the crossing of streets, and a visit to the school may do much to lessen the feeling of strangeness surrounding the experience.

If the child is taken to school by bus, or uses public transportation, a little coaching is in order so that he will know just what to do. These, among other little acts of consideration, will help him to help himself.

Meals Important

A good breakfast, leisurely eaten, is an excellent beginning for a school day. And, until the mid-teen age is reached, children should have at least 10 hours of sleep each night.

Most children take to this new life like ducklings to water and delight in this newly-found independence. It is up to parents and others concerned in their welfare, to make sure they are in good physical condition when starting to school and provide the environment and care that will keep them both healthy and happy.
